HOW TO PREPARE

- Create and review your family emergency plan.
- Assemble an emergency kit, including plastic sheeting, duct tape, and scissors, to seal off a room.
- Sign up for warnings and public safety information.

IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY

- Monitor local news media for emergency information.
- Avoid the incident scene.
- Evacuate or shelter in place immediately if ordered.

Following an incident, contact your doctor, nurse, or health care clinic if you display unusual symptoms.



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
